The zodiac is a 360-degree circle. When divided by the 12 conventional signs, we get segments of 30 degrees. However, when we divide that same 360-degree circle by the Moon's orbital cycle of approximately 27.3 days, we get 27 precise segments of 13 degrees and 20 minutes. Each of these segments is a Nakshatra. Because the Moon governs the mind, emotions, intuition, and subconscious conditioning, the Nakshatra the Moon occupied at your exact time of birth dictates your deepest psychological traits, how you process the world, and your core human characteristics.

The journey through the 27 Nakshatras is a complete evolutionary cycle of the soul. It begins with the spark of creation and raw survival instincts, moves through worldly ambition and material accumulation, and ends with spiritual dissolution and enlightenment.

Below is a comprehensive guide to the 27 Nakshatras, detailing the unique human characteristics, strengths, and shadow sides of each.

1. Ashwini

- **Symbol:** The Horse's Head
- **Ruling Planet:** Ketu (South Node)
- **Deity:** Ashwini Kumaras (Physicians of the Gods)
